
When not at school I like to spend time with my family. We enjoy going on long walks, visiting waterfalls, going to the beach and exploring country Victoria.




I am part of a family of four and my younger brother is 6 years old (Grade 1 this year!). I also recently got engaged to my partner of 5 years.
